-On March 1, Dr. Neupauer testified before the PA House Appropriations

well.

- -Dr. Neupauer attended the annual League for Innovation conference on March 5-7, in Philadelphia.

Students, April Beaman and Joy Dillon will be honored as part of the All-PA Academic Team at a banquet on April 2.
