PROPANE EMERGENCIES OPERATIONS

PPEO **8 HOURS**
PREREQUISITE: ELIF or EBM and training or certification to the OSHA/EPA Haz-Mat First Responder Operations level or greater.
CE # 002121 1 0/1

This program has been designed for fire fighters and related emergency response personnel whose duties meet the OSHA definition of the Operations level of hazardous materials response. Students will learn about the basic properties and hazards of propane and liquefied petroleum gases, containment vessel characteristics, and control strategies for the more common types of propane emergencies (consistent with the limitations of the Operations level).

PROPANE GAS PRACTICAL EXERCISES

PPPE **8 HOURS**
PREREQUISITES: PPEO OR PPET

This course is designed for the student who is competent in basic fire fighting skills such as hose line handling and SCBA, and who has a fundamental knowledge of propane/LNG and LNG container behavior under emergency conditions. It permits the material learned in the prerequisite SFA Local Level Course *Propane Emergencies Operations (PPEO)* or *Propane Emergencies Technician* to be applied to live-fire LNG scenarios using a variety of props.

VENTILATION PRACTICES

TRVP **16 HOURS**
PREREQUISITE: ELIF or EBM

This course will provide the student with the knowledge and skills to safely and efficiently perform ventilation in various situations. The course will build on the basic ventilation concepts learned in the Essentials I course. Topics include: building construction, air movement, tools and their use, natural and forced ventilation, and negative and positive pressure ventilation.

CONFINED SPACE RESCUE

CSR **16 HOURS**
PREREQUISITE: Persons attending this program should have experience, expertise, or training in subjects such as respiratory protection equipment including SCBA and/or rope rescue or rigging techniques. REPA and RORA are preferred prerequisites.
CE # 006076 7.5 hours 6.5/1

Students will learn a plan of operation, tools, manpower and manipulation skills required to perform safe removal of victims from limited space confinement. Emphasis is placed on safety and the psychological effects of confined space rescue. Students will participate in team rescue scenarios.

WILDERNESS SEARCH & RESCUE BASIC GRID
WSRB **8 HOURS**

PREREQUISITE: None

Basic Grid Team Course is designed to build on the skills presented in the Search Responder course. The course familiarizes the student with grid search techniques and additional navigation skills needed for search operations. The Basic Grid Team course provides training in types of search team grid techniques, intermediate navigation knowledge and skills, wilderness survival skills and practical evolutions. The course is presented in 8 hours: 2 hours are lecture, 2 hours are hands on classroom skills and the last 4 hours include hands on field skills. Students need to wear appropriate clothing for the outdoor environment and time of year for which the course is being offered. This will include appropriate footwear (hiking boots), proper insulating layers and rain wear. The student also needs to provide materials for taking notes (pencil or pen and tablet).

WILDERNESS SEARCH & RESCUE ADVANCED GRID
WSRA **8 HOURS**

PREREQUISITE: WSRB

Advanced Grid Team Course is built upon the skills in the Basic Grid Team course and is designed to familiarize the student with grid search techniques (specifically Type III techniques) advanced navigation skills and patient evacuation techniques. The Advanced Grid Team course provides training in Type III Grid techniques, establishing flag lines, packaging and evacuation of patients, awareness man tracking skills and advanced navigation knowledge and skills. The course is presented in 8 hours: 1 hour of the course is lecture, 3 hours are hands on classroom skills and the last 4 hours include hands on field skills. This course prepares the student for the DCNR Field Team Leader certification test. Students need to wear appropriate clothing for the outdoor environment and time of year for which the course is being offered. This will include appropriate footwear (hiking boots), proper insulating layers and rain wear. The student also needs to provide materials for taking notes (pencil or pen and tablet).

INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE ELIS 16 HOURS PREREQUISITE: NONE

This course is designed to introduce new firefighters to basic information including an overview of the fire service, fire service organization, firefighter safety, personal protective equipment and terrorism awareness. This is the first of four courses in the curriculum.

DELMAR HAZARDOUS MATERIALS OPERATIONS

24 HOURS

PREREQUISITE: Delmar Hazardous Materials Awareness or Equivalent

CE # 002011 24 hours 12/12

Course Goal: Students completing this course will be able to safely and effectively control, manage, and mitigate a hazardous materials release using first due resources until the arrival of additional specialized units. The goal is to prepare the student to respond and operate at the Hazardous Materials Operation level.

Course Description: The primary target audiences for this course are the First Responders charged with response actions associated with hazardous materials releases. Student will learn and adapt the knowledge and skill requirements for effective scene and response management. This program is designed to train and educate the student in hazardous materials response at the Hazardous Materials Operations level and in accordance with NFPA 472 of 2008 and 29 CFR 1910.120. This program is designed to give the first responder the necessary skills to handle hazardous materials emergencies.

FIRE FIGHTER I SKILLS ENHANCEMENT COURSE

32 Hrs. Classroom - 14 hrs. Lab - 18 hrs.

PREREQUISITE: ELIF or EBM or a combination of three (3) of the following 16 hour courses: Respiratory Protection (REPR/REPX), Engine Company Operations (ECOP), Truck Company Operations (TRCO/ATRC), Structural Burn Session (SBS), Ventilation Practices (TRVP), Structural Fire Rescue (SFR)

Minimum age for student in this class is 18.

This 32 hour course will run April 21 & 22 and May 19 & 20, 2012

This course is designed for experienced and trained fire fighters to refresh and reinforce Fire Fighter I competencies. These are the basic knowledges and skills required by a fire fighter who wishes to work efficiently, effectively and safely as part of a team on the fire ground. This course is designed to offer more focused practical skills application than the shorter Essentials Refresher.

HIGHWAY INCIDENT SCENE SAFETY AND MANAGEMENT

16 HOURS

**PREREQUISITE: ELIS
CE # 000611 8.5 hours 0/8.5**

The primary target audiences for this course are fire officers, firefighters, Fire Police, rescue, EMS and law enforcement personnel who command, respond to or work at highway incidents. Students will learn how to adapt the same safety and traffic control principles used to establish work zones in the highway construction and maintenance industries. They will be shown ways of applying these principles, using limited equipment and staffing, to enhance safety at emergency incidents on streets and highways. Topics covered include scene assessment, risk management, regulatory issues of temporary traffic control, necessary equipment, flagging, and personnel safety procedures. Practical exercises are included that let students apply what they have learned to "real world" incident scenarios.

This course is designed to provide a course of study and skill development for Fire Command Officers and the current impact laws, NFPA Standards, OSHA Standards, Mutual Aid Agreements, SOG's/SOO's/SRG's and other real issues impacting a fire command's management control of emergencies, disasters, and fires; to provide each Commander Officer with a structure to perform an analysis of risk exposures (i.e., legal, financial, and practical.) To provide various strategies and techniques in developing efficient and effective programs to address all hazard emergency response organizations; to identify critical, legal, and command control problems facing Chief Officers within Pennsylvania.
