

BC3 to hold Open Houses in March, April & May

(Butler) Butler County Community College (BC3) will hold an Open House at each location over the next several months. The \$25 application fee will be waived for prospective students who apply to BC3 at an Open House.

Attendees will learn about opportunities to:

- Jump start their college education while still in high school through BC3's College Pathways program;
- Start a career in just 1 year with a short-term workplace certificate in high demand fields;
- Transfer credit to another college or university to complete a bachelor's degree;
- Secure grants and scholarships to graduate from BC3 debt-free.

Attendees will also learn how they can earn a bachelor's degree on BC3 main campus through the following University Partnerships: B.S.B.A. in Accounting from Clarion University, B.S. in Organizational Leadership from Robert Morris University, B.S. in Business Administration from Franklin University (online), B.A. in Psychology from La Roche College, Bachelor in Social Work from Youngstown State, B.A. in Administration of Justice from the University of Pittsburgh, B.S. in Early Childhood (Pre K-4) and Special Education (Pre K-8) from Indiana University, and R.N. to B.S.N. in Nursing as well as a B.A. in Communications, Public Relations both from Chatham University. Transfer representatives will be also available from Slippery Rock University and Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine.

BC3 has 36 career programs, 18 transfer programs, and 19 certificates in the areas of Business, Health Care, Humanities and Social Sciences, and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math). BC3 offers courses in the classroom, as a hybrid, or online. Starting in the Fall 2016 semester, there will be 6 sessions available, including 3 five-week online sessions, giving students the opportunity to enroll later in the semester.
